A brief history...

- Mid-1940s -- theological librarians from United States and Canada gathered to discuss common interests
- Two primary concerns:
- number of important books in theology going out of print
- need for better bibliographic access to scholarly research materials in religion and theology



A brief history...

Initiated two projects:

Preservation project

- libraries loaned monographs and journals from their collections to ATLA
- used to create microform copies for permanent preservation purposes

Indexing project

- Initially librarians volunteered to index journals
- Later hired staff to continue the work



A brief history...

Officially formed as professional membership organization in 1946

- · Two arms: preservation and indexing
- Continued annual conference
- Merged a single organization in early 1990s



Mission

To foster the study of theology and religion by enhancing the development of theological and religious studies libraries and librarianship

- Around 840 members primarily in U.S. and Canada




New Production System
