GlobeTheoLib is a project that aims to facilitate the exchange of a core basic theological knowledge. In order to serve this purpose, it will collect, evaluate and disseminate theological resources from around the world.

Objectives:

- Individual users, theological institutions, educators and students (who can find themselves full-time users)
- Academics, theologians, scholars, students, seminarians, pastoralists, church leaders, laypeople, etc.
- Innovation of teaching and research through global partners
- Creation of a platform for theological education and research, which will be open to all
- Church and pastoral ministries (engaging common issues)
- Regional academic exchanges and Christian World Committees (dissemination of ecumenical research)
